- Post secondary schools require English and Social at the -1 level. If you think you are capable of the -1 courses but your effort in grade 10 wasn't strong, please talk to an advisor.
- If you have taken the path of least resistance, you can upgrade while in high school. Please talk to your grad coach about what options are available to you.
- Make sure that the classes you are choosing relate to your career goals.
- Update the professional portfolio you started last year.
- Be sure to keep track of important dates.
- Make time to meet with your grad coach periodically throughout the year.

If you haven't already obtained the following, now is the time to apply for a:

- Social Insurance Number
- Drivers license / government ID
- Bank account.

- 3. Add this academic goal to your About Me Portfolio.
- **4.** Add **ONE (1) Other Goal (short or medium term)** and include an Action Plan for how you intend to achieve them. This could be anything you would like to improve on.
- 5. Add this goal to your **About Me Portfolio**.
- **6.** Write a brief **reflection** about why you've set these goals (What are you trying to achieve? Why? How does it fit in a bigger plan?).

- **4.** Identify a Job Posting (Select the **Work** section in the navigation menu and select **Job Search** to find real-time Job Postings from Indeed.ca).
- **5.** Add an **Objective** to your resume for the job posting you selected.

- 6. Complete the Volunteer Experience section and add any Work Experience you have acquired up to this point.
- 7. Add any additional experiences that you'd like to record.

Ensure you are aware of the correct courses and marks you require to get into the post-secondary option of your choice. What is your plan "B"?

If you are interested in a career in health, Grade 11 is the only year you can participate in the Health Internship Program – a 6-week paid summer internship.

Join extracurricular and volunteer activities at school and in your community to develop responsibility, teamwork and leadership skills – these will help later with scholarships, admittance to programs and resume writing. There are lots of one day opportunities!

- Student council

- Work experience opportunities
- Scorekeeping and officiating at school sport events

Listen for announcements or ask in your school or community about opportunities to participate in special career related programs such as:

- Fire or Police Academy
- Jr. Forest Ranger
- Job shadowing
- Summer Internship Programs

Plan to attend career fairs such as:

- 'It's a Matter of Choice' annual post-secondary career fair is held in the Fall
- 'Pathways' conference
- Aboriginal Student Discovery Day at the U of A

If apprenticeship for a trade interests you as a post-secondary option, find out if you can start the RAP program. You could start your apprenticeship training while attending high school.

• Begin by clarifying your top three trades

Plan a visit/research a variety of post-secondary institutions (2-3) that you may be interested in. Most institutions offer:

Tours

- Open house events
- Evening informational session about a potential program of interest
- Student for a day opportunities

Research financial aid opportunities – consider getting summer employment, part-time work, scholarship, bursaries, grants, etc.

- Complete a practice application for a student loan. There are often a large number of documents required to apply and it is helpful to have these ahead of time.
- Talk about financial aid and student loan information with your parents.
 - Some financial aid programs are available for application in Grade 11
- Check out options for scholarships, grants or bursaries. Apply if applicable and listen closely to the May and June announcements for information.
- Look at the criteria for the Grade 12 scholarships, and plan to apply.

Make sure you work hard and get good grades. Sometimes conditional acceptances from post-secondary institutions are based on Grade 11 marks.

Update your Portfolio. Keep track of all the new academic, extracurricular and community work you have done since last year. Did you take a first aid or other community courses? If so, make a copy of any course certificates and place them in your portfolio.
